NL Cy Young winner | Kenny Pickett sees **Blake Snell agrees** to 2-year Giants deal

Blake Snell, who claimed his second Biake Shell, who claimed his second Cy Young Award after two bounce-back seasons, finally agreed to a deal just more than a week before opening day. Snell has agreed to a two-year, \$62 million deal with the San Francisco

\$62 million deal with the San Francisco Giants, a person with direct knowledge of the agreement told USA TODAY Sports. The person spoke on condition of anonymity because the deal was not yet finalized. The deal includes an optout after the first season.

Suddenly, a Giants offseason that started out in a slumber ended with a stunning flourish.

Earlier this month, the Giants added third baseman Matt Chapman on a similar short-term deal with multiple opt-

The recent agreements with the two Scott Boras clients caps a winter that in-cluded a \$113 million commitment to South Korean center fielder Jung Hoo Lee, a three-year, \$42 million deal for DH Jorge Soler, a four-year, \$44 million deal for closer-turned-starter Jordan Hicks and a trade for former American League Cy Young winner Robbie Ray, who won't be available until close to mideasen.

Snell, who turned 31 on Dec. 4, had a Snell, who turned 31 on Dec. 4, had a dominant season for the San Diego Padres, leading the major leagues in ERA (2.25), adjusted ERA (182) and fewest hits per nine innings (5.8). That capped a two-year stretch in which he posted a 2.72 ERA over a 56-start stretch.

Snell's five-year, \$50 million contract

extension he signed with the Tampa Bay Rays expired after this season, and this was his initial free agent foray. He won the 2018 AL Cy Young with Tampa Bay but struggled with consis-tency in the three seasons that fol-lowed, particularly after the 2020 trade that sent him from the Rays to the Padres.

Yet he hit his stride again in his final two seasons with the Padres, setting himself up for a lucrative offseason. Just one that lasted a lot longer than he

surely would've preferred.

"You go through pockets of doubt,"
Snell said after winning the Cy Young in November.
"And then I remind myself, 'You're

get a chance to go somewhere else to continue to grow my career," he said. "I just think it's a good reset. I think getting a chance to play on this team in that quarterback room with a couple great guys, helping those guys out any way I can and just be ready if my number's called somewhere down the road. "It's a crazy, crazy league, crazy business, just trying to put my best foot forward and be an asset for this team."



"Everyone wants to win now. It's an extremely competitive league," Pickett said. "I think every franchise, every organization handles it differently. I don't think there's any right or wrong way. It's just kinda how the business has transpired over these past couple of years. I think as young players, I think everyone understands what you're getting yourself into when you make it to this level."

Pickett said he's not worried about playing on a team that has a clear starter in Jalen Hurts. He said he has familiarity with the team from when they scouted him ahead of the 2022 draft and he is looking forward to joining a team that has the same "core values."

Saints sign former No. 2 pick to bolster pass rush

The New Orleans Saints are making a move in an attempt to shore up a weakness in their pass rush.

The team announced that it has signed former San Francisco 49ers and Washington Commanders defensive

end Chase Young.

NFI. Network reported that Young and Saints agreed to a one-year, \$13 million contract.

Young, 24, had been one of the top remaining free agents available, ranking No. 4 on USA TODAY Sports' list of the No. 4 on USA TOUAY Sports ist of the top 25 remaining free agents, though the No. 2 player on that list, offensive tackle Tyron Smith, reportedly agreed to a deal with the Jets.

Young was the No. 2 overall selection in the 20/20 NFL draft. He earned defensive rockie of the wear hours that seasons to the seasons was not set to the seasons the seasons was seasons.

He has 16.5 career sacks, with 7.5 coming in both his rookie season and in the 2023 season – a year when Wash-ington traded him to the 49ers in late October. San Francisco deployed Young in pass rush-specific situations, and he

sues, including a torn anterior cruciate ligament in November 2021; he played in just 12 games during the 2021 and 2022 seasons, posting only 1.5 sacks in

The Saints, however, had a dire need for a pass rusher. New Orleans was tied for 28th in sacks (34) in 2023 was tied for Zert in sacks (34) in 2023 and 29th in sacks per pass attempt (6.09%). The 34 sacks marked the team's lowest output since the 2016 season, and the team's leader in sacks was defensive end Carl Granderson, who recorded just 8.5.
